In the modern age, exploitation of nature has been accepted as a pre-condition for progress. Man is arrogant enough to assert his victory over nature as well as on fellow humans. It is like savagery shifting to the towns from the shrinking forests.

The rich countries warn the poor countries against the use of science and technology to exploit nature too much; while they themselves have been doing it for long. They also disapprove of and distrust our poverty. How can the poor get rid of poverty without using technology to exploit natural resources? The poor tribals cannot be expected to preserve the environment unless we provide them an alternative support for survival.

Population-explosion is not, indeed, the only cause of problems in this world. The thickly populated poor countries do not consume as much as the materially rich people-though they are more in number. They are equally responsible for the impoverishment of environment. The real confrontation is not between the conservation of natural life and human progress; it is the problem of stopping irresponsible robbing of nature to prove one's superior efficiency. The world admire a successful man, whatever his methods. Industrialisation has accelerated this self centred robbery in the name of progress. They produce things neither necessary nor disposable when used and thrown; and this is spoiling the environment.

All of our modern theories-are based on a false belief that acquisition, greed or profit is the fundamental instinct that motivates all human behaviour. Such theories are bound to endanger the balance between man and natural environment. Even pollution is not so much a technical problem; it is the outcome of self-centred behaviour showing unconcern for others, and betraying a narrowness of view point.
